To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a true spirit of Americanism; to preserve the memories of our former members and the associations of our members and our forefathers in all Wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and masses; to make right the master of might; to promote peace and good will on earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; to consecrate and sanctify our friendship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness; to adopt in letter and spirit all of the great principles for which The American Legion stands; and to assist in carrying on for God and Country.



★ The Order of Business of the Convention is subject to change as necessary:

The actions of an annual Convention of the Detachment of Illinois are subject to the approval of the Department of Illinois Sons of The American Legion Liaison (Advisory) Committee and through them to the Department of Illinois, The American Legion Department Executive Committee.

★ Procedure for Registration of Delegates, Alternate Delegates and Guests of the Detachment Convention:

If a certification of Delegates and Alternates has not been filed in advance with Department Headquarters, the certification may be filed by the first available member of a squadron, filed with the registrar upon arrival at the Convention Registration Desk. Any squadron member may register as a delegate or alternate up the maximum number allowed for that squadron.

If a squadron late submits a Certification Form, those delegates and alternates already registered <u>WILL</u> <u>NOT BE CHANGED</u>. Those additional names on the certification shall be allowed to register for whatever remaining representation is allowed for that squadron.

★ Meeting of the National Convention Delegates and Alternates:

Immediately following the adjournment of the 62nd Annual Detachment Convention, meet with Rick Allen, Immediate Past Detachment of Illinois Commander, Delegation Chairman.

All elected delegates and alternates to the 53rd Annual Sons of The American Legion National Convention assembled in Tampa, FL will meet to relay information and instructions.

★ Detachment Executive Committee Meeting:

Immediately following the adjournment of the National Convention Delegates and Alternates Meeting meet with newly elected Detachment of Illinois Commander.

The newly elected Detachment Commander, Detachment Sr. Vice Commander, All Division Commanders, Division Vice Commanders, District Commanders, District Vice Commanders, National Executive Committeeman, Alternate Executive Committeeman, Past Detachment of Illinois Commanders, and Past National Commanders shall meet for the purpose of necessary appointments and any other business that shall come before the Executive Committee.



Rules of the Detachment Convention

Rules of the 61st Annual Convention of the Detachment of Illinois and the Temporary Rules of the 62nd Annual Convention

- 1. The parliamentary procedure of the Annual Detachment Convention shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, and a herein modified.
- 2. The organization of the convention shall be in accordance with the rules submitted herewith and the Call for Convention here afore issued by the Detachment Adjutant.
- 3. A quorum shall exist when thirteen (13) Districts or three (3) Divisions are represented by Delegates and Alternates present.
- 4. A vote of the Convention shall be polled by the twenty-three (23) Districts. Said Districts are those as provided in Article III of the Detachment Constitution.
- 5. When a roll call is ordered, Each District Chairman shall announce the vote of his District when called by the Convention Chairman.
- 6. Squadrons need not cast their votes as a unit nor need a District vote be cast as a unit, but the total votes for or against a proposition shall be announced by the District Chairman. A requirement for unit voting is prohibited.
- 7. When a poll of any District is demanded by a Delegate of that said District, the Secretary of the Convention shall poll the vote of that District by Squadron without any debate or discussion of the question on which the vote is being demanded. Said poll shall take place at the conclusion of the Roll Call of Districts.
- 8. Each Delegate shall be entitled to one (1) vote. The vote of a Delegate absent and not represented by an Alternate shall be cast with the majority of the Delegates present from his District.
- 9. Each District shall be entitled to one (1) Advisor and one (1) Alternate Advisor, who are members of The American Legion and who are members of a Post within the geographical boundaries of said District. Said Advisor and Alternate Advisor shall have voice but no vote.
- 10. No Delegate shall be permitted to talk more than once on any one subject, unless he has made the motion relating to the subject, and then only twice. No Delegate shall be permitted to talk longer than five (5) minutes on any one subject, except by the consent of a majority of the Delegates present. Chairmen of Convention Committees, or the minority representative, in the case of a minority report, may speak as frequently as may be necessary in connection with the report of their committee and in the event of a debate, the presiding officer shall not entertain a motion which will curtail further debate without affording the Chairman or Committee Representative an opportunity for rebuttal.
- 11. No Alternate, Advisor or Alternate Advisor shall be permitted to talk more than once on any one subject not longer than three (3) minutes.
- 12. The Convention shall have the following Committees: Rules, Credentials, Constitutional Amendments, National Delegate Nominations, Membership and Squadron activities, Americanism, Children and Youth, Legislation, National Security, Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation, and Resolutions.
- 13. Each Convention Committee shall meet and elect its own Chairman and Secretary.
- 14. Voting shall be by acclamation, except when a roll call shall be demanded by one or more Delegates from four (4) Districts, or the Chairmen from at least four (4) Districts, except in the election of Detachment Officers.
- 15. Each District shall elect a Chairman for that District, except those Districts which have organized and elected Officers. In such Districts, the Commander shall be the Chairman.
- 16. The Detachment Officers to be elected by this convention shall be those provided in Article VI of the Detachment Constitution.
- 17. Nominations for Detachment Officers shall be from the floor on a roll call of Districts numerically arranged.

- Each District may present as many candidates as it chooses.
- 18. All nomination and seconding speeches are limited to only members of the Sons of The American Legion Detachment Convention with appropriate Sons of The American Legion cap and Detachment Convention delegate badge.
- 19. In the event that more than two (2) candidates are nominated for any one (1) office, the balloting shall continue until one candidate receives a majority vote of the convention.
- 20. When a Delegate, Alternate Delegate, Advisor or Alternate Advisor desires to address the convention or when a Delegate desires to make a motion, he shall rise, state his name and the number of his Squadron and District before proceeding.
- 21. Until the Convention Committee on Credentials shall report, sitting Delegates shall constitute the temporary convention, provided, however, that no committee report shall be acted upon prior to the report of the Credentials Committee, the Rules Committee excepted.
- 22. Resolutions, printed in the Resolutions book, need be only reported by number, as long as the committee recommendation is to accept or reject, in total, as printed. Any special resolutions and any numbered resolution that is amended must be read and reported on separately.
- 23. The Business Session of the Convention will be outlined in the Official Convention Program or as otherwise decided by the convention body in session.
- 24. The consent of two-thirds (2/3) of the voting strength of the Convention shall be necessary for the suspension of any Rule of this Convention.
- 25. There shall be no food or alcoholic beverages allowed on the Convention floor during the Convention Sessions.
- 26. Disruption of Convention business during any of the regularly scheduled Convention Sessions will not be tolerated. Upon the first disruption, to be determined by the Detachment Commander, the Detachment Sergeant at Arms will issue a "warning" to the offending party. If a second disruption occurs, the Detachment Sergeant at Arms will escort the offending party from the Convention floor for the remainder of that convention session.
- 27. Appropriate attire will be required of all Detachment Officers and all members of the Detachment who will be addressing the Convention from the podium. Appropriate attire for the above mentioned will consist of: dress slacks, collared shirt, jacket, tie and Sons of The American Legion cap.
- 28. Any member of the Detachment who will be approaching the podium for the purpose of making a donation, accepting an award or any other purpose shall wear appropriate attire consisting of: dress slacks, collared shirt, jacket, tie and Sons of The American Legion cap.

2025 Final Report

The Russia Vs. Ukraine war continues, Peace talks have stalled with Ukraine accusing Russia of stalling. The shelling continues. The United States have made several attempts to get both to the bargaining table. Ukraine and Russia have been maneuvering to set the terms and tempo of peace negotiations, while simultaneously trying to win over the White House, which has threatened to pull out of the talks altogether.

Since the new Administration has taken over the border to Mexico has been locked down. Illegal crossings are minimal. ICE has begun deporting Illegal Immigrants with criminal records and shipping them back. So called Sanctuary that at far left run continue to try and block ICE. In response Federal funds are, or be threatened yp, be held back. There are several lawsuits pending from both sides.

China is still posturing itself against Japan and Taiwan by blocking shipping lanes and violating air space. In response the United States have sent U.S. Navy Ships into the area.

The Department of Justice has deemed members of the gang MS-13 as being members of a terrorist organization. These individuals are being targeted by ICE.

Protest have continued across America for both pro and anti Israeli war issues fighting

Hamas. The United States Government has striped and threatening to strip visas of individuals here on visas if protesting supporting Hamas.

Convention Report

July 11 - 13, 2025

Three of the commission members promoted projects and reported on them this year. **Bruno**– Operation <u>Comfort Warriors</u> – This is also the commanders VA & R project - Today, wounded warriors need a variety of items to help in their recovery. Some patients might need loose-fitting sweatsuits to cover their healing wounds without adding pressure to burns sustained during a rocket attack. Others might need an iPod to help drown out the tinnitus that has plagued their ears since their vehicle struck an IED. Still others might need fitness equipment to rebuild strength in their muscles. From gift cards to patients at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, to electronics for Marines at Camp Pendleton, OCW represents the Legion's expression of gratitude. These gifts will not make our wounded warriors whole again, but they do express the Legion's gratitude. The program relies on funds, which are used to purchase items for the servicemembers.

Chris – <u>The Haven</u> is a day camp, nestled near the shore of Crab Orchard Lake, The Haven provides veterans a change of pace. A one-of-a-kind spot unique to Southern Illinois, The Haven is a recreational facility with a day Lodge owned and operated by the 5th Division American Legion family. For the rehabilitation and entertainment of veterans from the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Marion.

Bryson –Reported on 2 projects this year. As a volunteer at the <u>Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery</u>. He reported on the total internments at ALNC of 77,803 & as of February of this year they had 273 Internments. <u>Flags of Honor</u> – this a program that Bryson is doing at his squadron 1080 in Joliet. Flags can be purchased for \$35 & you submit the name of a veteran to honor. The field of flags will was displayed at Joliet Post 1080 from May 1 to June 1. The VAR commission purchased 3 flags from the VAR budget. One flag in the name of TAL Dept IL. The other 2 are at the discretion of squad 1080, and they were given to two families who could not afford to purchase a flag.

Promoters Reports:

GTY – Jimmy Hunter – Last year the Detachment raised \$10,884 & the goal this year is for \$12,000. The drawing as always will be during the Detachment Convention.

Poppy – Butch Ray – In 2025, <u>National Poppy Day</u>, which is observed on the Friday before Memorial Day, will be on May 23rd. The American Legion Auxiliary, in conjunction with other members of The American Legion Family, organizes this day to honor fallen soldiers and support veterans. Poppies are distributed, and people are asked to donate to help support veterans and their families.

The red poppy became a symbol of remembrance after World War I, inspired by the 1915 poem "In Flanders Fields" by Lt. Col. John McCrae, which described poppies growing among soldiers' graves in Flanders. Moina Michael, moved by the poem, began wearing a red poppy in tribute and campaigned for its adoption as a national symbol of remembrance.

On September 27, 1920, the American Legion adopted the poppy as its official memorial flower to honor those who fought and died in war. In 1924, the Legion began a national program to distribute poppies, with donations supporting veterans, active-duty military, and their families. The American Legion Auxiliary leads the annual distribution and fundraising efforts.

The poppy is important because it serves as a visible reminder of the sacrifices made by U.S. servicemembers and supports ongoing aid for veterans and their families. Wearing the poppy, especially on National Poppy Day (the Friday before Memorial Day), honors the fallen and shows support for those who have served. **Memorial Day:** Memorial Day is on the last Monday of May, which falls on May 26th in 2025. **Poppy Day:** is a tradition brought to the United States by the American Legion Family, with the goal of recognizing the sacrifices made by veterans and military personnel. **National Poppy Day:** The Friday before Memorial Day is designated as National Poppy Day, and the American Legion Auxiliary leads efforts to distribute poppies and collect donations. **Purpose:** The purpose of National Poppy Day is to educate the public about the poppy's significance as a symbol of remembrance and to raise funds for veteran support programs.

Veterans Employment & Education (VE&E) - Bruno Williamson – Nationally there is no movement on that commission. Det/Dept – nothing much other than promoting job fairs & stand downs.

Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services (VAVS) – Bruno Williamson - of the 5 VAMC's in Illinois we have SAL Representation in 4 of them. **Jessie Brown** – Derrick Stinson is the Representative; **Illiana** – Bruno Williamson is the Rep; Phil Shipley is the Deputy Rep; **Marion** – Jeff Trout is the Rep & Chris Schoo is the Dep Rep. **Edward Hines** -Bryson Taylor.

We are still looking for a Rep at Cpt James Lovell Federated/Great Lakes. Zach Van Horn is interested in being the Rep at Jefferson Barracks VAMC in St. Louis.

To be a Representative or a Regularly Scheduled volunteer you only must volunteer 4 times a year. If you are the Rep/Dep and you go to the quarterly meetings; you have technically fulfilled your obligation.

WE have 5 state VA homes & we currently have 1 rep at Manteno – Jimmy Hunter: Anna – Wayne Madson. And we could use Reps at Lasalle, Quincy & Chicago. The volunteer process is a little different from the federal VA's so contact the state homes volunteer services to get their application process

National VA&R Chairman Williamson-

National VA&R is promoting this year – VA's Compassionate Contact Corp; NVAD (May17th); Camp Hope (PTSD pgm); Red Coat Ambassadors; Honor Flight; Be The One & VA S.A.V.E. Training. The National VA&R commission continues to work with the National VE&E Commission on Veterans Suicide awareness. That said the National SAL Chairman of the new Ad Hoc committee for BTO has asked all Detachments to have a BTO promoter. Byson Taylor has taken on this new position. The National Charles Rigsby award has been updated to reflect the changing times

Lastly, The SAL Nationally have VAVS Representatives in 52 VA's of the 154 VAMC's across the country. The National goal is to have representation in 60 VA's.
